Whereas, Participants of a 2016 survey felt that community pharmacists play an important role in providing care for transgender persons, but less than 30% felt confident in their abilities to manage health concerns of transgender patients, and,

Whereas, The care of transgender persons may include use of complex hormone regimens that pharmacists should be equipped to help manage, and,

Resolved That: The New York State Council of Health-system Pharmacists supports the incorporation of the education on transgender patient care into New York State pharmacy school curricula.
