Whereas, Pharmacogenomics is the study of how genetics affects a patient's response to drug therapy to ensure medications are prescribed at safe and effective doses<sup>1</sup>, and,

Whereas, the Clinical Pharmacogenetics Implementation Consortium contains a registry of over 200 medications, including high-risk medications such as warfarin, and whose guidelines are endorsed by ASHP<sup>2</sup>, and,

Whereas, Pharmacists have unique abilities and skills related to medication knowledge, and,

Whereas, the American Society of Health-systems Pharmacists recommends that pharmacists play a prominent role in the application of clinical pharmacogenomics, including, but not limited to, drug therapy recommendations to improve medication-related outcomes<sup>3</sup>, and,

Whereas, the field of pharmacogenomics is expected to increase in coming years, including the integration of pharmacogenomics data into patient care decision-making, therefore, be it

Resolved That: The New York State Council of Health-system Pharmacists encourages pharmacist education and training in the field of clinical pharmacogenomics, and supports involvement of Pharmacists in the implementation and application of pharmacogenomics practices within their institutions.
