Summary: The Council once again enjoyed a strong year from our membership in FY 19-20. Record highs in "total" and "active" members were seen in the months of September and October respectively. A small dip in March 2020 can largely be attributed to a number of "associate" members reaching their expiry date and not renewing as of yet.

Though the Council's membership remains very strong, it will be more important than ever during the COVID-19 crisis for the Council to continue to provide value to our members and prospective members. It will be equally important for our local leaders to continue to engage their members and prospective members in innovative ways to ensure our growth continues.

B) <u>Committee Strategic Plan: Goals and Accomplishments</u>

1) Continue to grow counsel membership as well as improve/streamline retention of current NYSCHP members

Committee goals:

- a) Optimize the Council's membership database
 - a. Some quirks/oddities exist within our membership database that extend back to our old database that was used several years ago
 - b. The database would allow members to sign up for some membership statuses that they didn't qualify for
 - c. We have fixed an error found with "student" memberships and continue to optimize both the "join" and "renewal" functions of the database
- b) Engage members and potential members in innovative ways
 - a. The COVID-19 crisis will force the Council to change the way local and state business is run
 - b. CEs, board meetings, recruitment, and other communications will largely need to switch to being virtual only
 - c. Local leaders working on innovative ways to engage their members and prospective members
- c) Better align NYSCHP with ASHP
 - a. A goal of ours is to better align the Council with our national partner ASHP to optimize costs and value
 - b. **Update**: Ongoing. Discussions continue to be had with other state level organizations as well as ASHP as to the benefits, downfalls and implications of potentially having a joint membership and other forms of alignment
